

The HEERF Grant application period is now CLOSED

Dear Pima Medical Institute Students;

Pima Medical Institute has received additional emergency grants from the U.S. Department of Education via the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) as authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA). **The CRRSAA Grant disbursed to you is tax-free and does not have to be repaid.**

The CRRSAA grant is intended to help students with any component of the student's cost of attendance for emergency costs that arise due to coronaviruses, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), or childcare. We sincerely hope that this grant will assist you and your family with all your "back to school" needs. The total amount of the CRRSAA Grant will be distributed to eligible students until funds are expended. Priority consideration will be given to students with the highest financial need.

To be eligible for the CRRSAA Grant-Phase I, a student must be in an active enrollment status on July 1, 2021. To determine awards based on financial need, students must have submitted a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the 2020-2021 or 2021-2022 academic year and have an Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) on file by July 1, 2021. Dual enrollment, distance education, and continuing education students are eligible. International students, DACA students, or undocumented students do not qualify under current DOE guidance. No application is required for Phase I. Students who meet the eligibility requirements provided by the U.S. Department of Education (DOE) will be awarded the emergency grant. Grants will range from \$150.00 to \$1400.00 depending on the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from the student's most recent ISIR (see chart below). An estimated 7,600 PMI students will be eligible for the CRRSAA-Phase I grant.

CRRSAA Grant-Phase I is being distributed to students the week of August 9, 2021, via the current selection method (check/ACH). Please allow 14-21 days for check delivery by mail.

CRRSAA Grant-Phase II will be offered to all active students enrolled between July 1, 2021, and January 14, 2022, who are experiencing expenses related to coronavirus (including eligible expenses under the student's cost of attendance as stated above), will have an opportunity to apply for a \$500.00 emergency grant. The application will be available beginning August 30, 2021. Students that receive CRRSAA Grant-Phase I are eligible to apply for the Phase II emergency grant. However, students can only apply for Phase II one time, and subsequent applications will not be processed.

We are grateful for your dedication during the COVID-19 pandemic. In our effort to insure educational continuance, we hope Pima Medical's staff and faculty have assisted you during this national crisis while transitioning to distance education and subsequently to a hybrid platform. We strive to maintain our commitment to serving you, your family, and your future in healthcare.

Dear Pima Medical Institute Students;

Pima Medical Institute has received and will allocate funds from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF) as part of the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act directly to students (CARES Grant). Pima Medical Institute has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement that assures the Department of Education that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency funds to students. Students that were enrolled and active in a campus-based program at Pima Medical Institute on March 13, 2020, and can attest to incurring expenses resulting from the interruption of campus operations are eligible for the CARES Grant.

Pima Medical Institute will disburse the CARES grant to eligible students. Under the CARES Act and the regulatory guidance from the Department of Education, Pima Medical Institute will consider the following subset of qualified students:

- A student must have been in an active status on March 13, 2020;
- A student must attest they are or could be eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (HEA) [20 USC 1091(a)], may receive emergency financial aid grants;
- A student must be meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) at the time of disbursement;
- A student must be currently active, on an approved Leave of Absences (LOA), or have graduated on or after March 13, 2020;
- A student must sign a Certification and Acknowledgement, indicating eligible expenses were incurred due to the interruption of campus operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Expenses can include but are not limited to the cost of food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and childcare. Certifications and Acknowledgement can be accessed and electronically signed on the PMI Student Portal.

Important Notice: To ensure prompt distribution of the CARES Grant, please verify that the address the institution has on file is accurate. You can access information through the Student Portal and make any necessary changes to your information. If applicable, include building or apartment number to ensure prompt delivery. Please make all address changes before completing the Certification and Acknowledgement. The delivery method is based on the document on file with the Institution regarding refund/stipend returns (Check/ACH).

All eligible students will receive the CARES Grant funds while available after receiving the Certification and Attestation. CARES Grant amounts were established based on the estimated number of eligible students and the total amount of funds granted to the institution. Disbursements will be disbursed in two equal payments. The first disbursement will occur within 14 days of receipt of the Certification and Attestation, and the second disbursement will occur on or before July 31, 2020.
